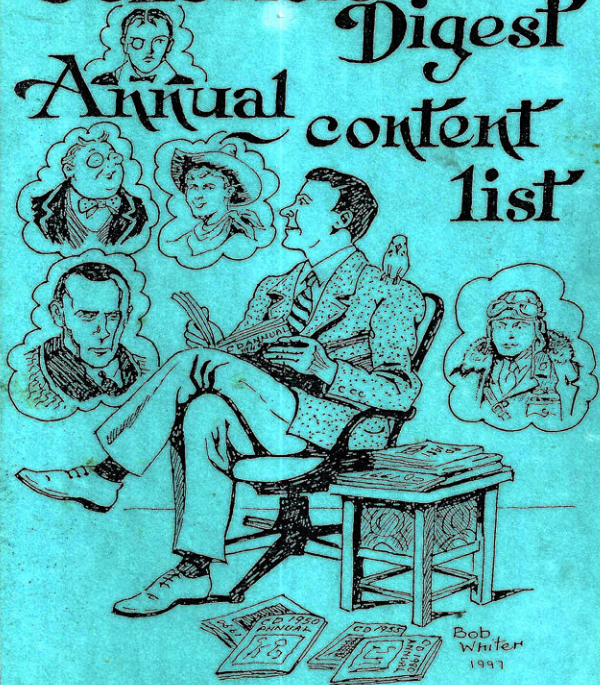

The 'Mr. Buddle' fictional stories by Eric Fayne are already listed in the Content list. These tales did introduce references to the Companion papers and sometimes even excerpts from The Gem & The Magnet. The characters in the Buddle stories were original, although some affinities could be found with Hamiltonian characters.

The Buddle tales were well-written school stories. They also appeared in the monthly Story Paper Collectors' Digest.
